TRANSPORTATION NEWS / INCLEMENT WEATHER DIRECTIONS:

A. With a few exceptions, bus behavior has been good this year. Please take a few minutes to reinforce expectations for behavior. The rules ask that students stay seated and talk quietly to students sharing their seat. We are committed to providing safe transportation to and from school each day.

B. It is the time of year when we must be concerned with inclement weather and what to do if it occurs. On days in question, the decision to hold school typically made before 10:00 PM. Once a decision is made, the local media is alerted so they can make the announcement. If the decision is to hold school as usual, there will be **NO** announcement. If the decision is to open school after a 2-hour delay, buses will run their regular routes on a 2-hour delay. For example, if your child normally boards the bus at 7:50 a.m., he or she will board the bus at 9:50 a.m. We will post a message on the school voice mail with the latest information.

C. When school is closed early due to inclement weather, radio and television will carry this announcement. Please try to limit your phone calls to the school so we can keep our lines open for emergency communications. Thanks!

DAILY CHANGES FOR RIDERS / BUSES: Please send your child's teacher a note in the morning when their afternoon transportation will be different than their normal mode of transportation. We are asking that parents/guardians who need to make an **emergency** change in how their child/children go home after school call the office **no later** than 1:30 p.m.

This gives us a chance to deliver messages to teachers in a timely manner. We appreciate your help with this matter.

PARENT / GUARDIAN REMINDERS: We have several reminders for our parents and guardians:

- Parents / guardians should always bring students to the office to sign in when they are tardy.
- Students should when they are going different way other



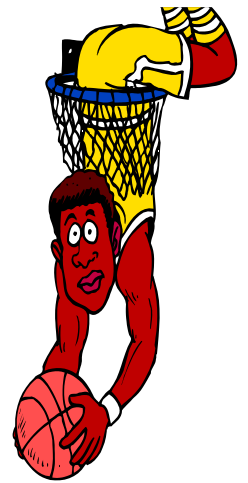
